Dear Friends,

For me it is going to a place near water or up high to somewhere where you can see for miles, where the sky reaches the ground or sea. We all need this, and the summer gives us a chance to get away from our normal lives and have a holiday in which we cannot only be refreshed, be renewed but also be ready to re-engage with our lives again. Our problems won't go away but our ability to cope with them will be better.

As a church we pray that all of you will have time for refreshment during the holiday season and that you will come back renewed and re-energise for the days ahead.



The Parish Council held its first Annual PARISH Meeting since April 2019. The first for some of our Council Members, including the Proper Officer. The meeting was well attended by members of the public; predominantly those attending were not Cubbington Parishioners. Sadly, many of whom were disruptive and confrontational which is against the spirit and harmony that the Parish Council are trying to create.

At the meeting we reflected on all the work that has taken place since April 2019 including:

A grant from WCC helped support the clearing of the drainage ditch along the boundary with Boddington Close, along with a contractor a team of Parish Councillors planted 150m of new hedgerow. This has taken very well and will provide a necessary screen for our neighbours. The ditch is maintained by engagement with the Community Payback Team supervised by a councillor.

Following a grant from WALC (Warwickshire Association of Local Councils) a contractor was engaged to complete the 400metre of path around the Recreation Ground. This was a very well received during the various Lockdowns due to the Pandemic enabling everyone to get out and about for their daily exercise.

Two successful grants from Groundworks have enabled two major projects. The first a £120,000 project to update the two play areas on the Recreation Ground and Austen Court. The second grant of £75,000 included updating the basketball court to a safer surface; more play equipment and the installation of a Sensory Garden.

A CCTV system has also been installed which records activities 24 hours per day in and around the Recreation Ground. Installation of a new pole and equipment will enable the images to be shared with WDC.

Following various other grants over 200 trees, plants and shrubs have been planted on the Recreation Ground and a rainwater harvesting system installed to help with the climate emergency. Free trees provided by the Woodland Trust were brought on in our nursery and have been planted by the Community Payback Team in Austen Court, once established they will provide a screen between the play area and the HS2 track, these trees are mainly Rowan (Mountain Ash) which do not grow very tall but are an excellent source of colour and food for wildlife.

The facilities now available to Cubbington parishioners are a fabulous addition and were essential during the pandemic and the various lockdowns; they have been very well received and are extensively used.

The Parish Council now looks after an asset register of £1.5m; this requires very tight financial controls by our RFO on a yearly precept of circa £50,000. Before we start any work or updates, grant funding is the investigated.

Councillors Watkins and Willoughby have worked hard in creating a Neighbourhood Plan, something that has been talked about for many years but lacked the drive and ambition required. This requires a great deal of effort, and the Parish Council are

grateful for the hours that have been spent on this so far. The first grant application has been successful, so the work continues.

The Parish Council has now looked at ensuring the 2 buildings within the Parish Council ownership remain viable. A contractor has been booked to remove the internal wall in the Pavilion; this will open up the room and enable more, much needed revenue from lettings, giving increased height and area. Work will commence in September. Some of the cost has been met by grant funding from Warwick District Council, which we are grateful for.

The Village Hall has come to a crossroads in its life and unfortunately will not survive financially if left without some form of interaction. The Annual Accounts for 2021 for the Village Hall are displayed on the various Noticeboards for anyone who is interested.

Since taking over running the Village Hall in February 2022 the Parish Council have had to cover the running costs. We have also had to cover a £1,700 electricity debt with the energy supplier. Fortunately, this was realised, and we were able to rectify and keep the Village Hall open. However, still to date the Village Hall bank account has not been made available.

The Village Hall must now stand on its own two feet and generate enough income for its running and maintenance costs.

To quote one of the lovely letters received following the consultation to all parishioners by our leaflet asking for their wishes- – ***change is a challenge for the brave and the bold.***

Thank you to those of you who took the time to respond to our leaflet, we were overwhelmed with the response!

We will hold a public meeting for parishioners when we have gathered the ideas put forward. We want the Village Hall to be a community hub for all of Cubbington to enjoy.


